



Midterm Assessment Process MAP



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The Midterm Assessment Process (MAP)

provides an instructor with rich and meaningful feedback from students regarding the learning environment while a course is still in progress.

MAP is a confidential and voluntary service. MAPs are intentionally completed at midterm to allow the instructor to make meaningful changes during the course. Instructors may use this assessment as a way to begin a dialogue with students about course content and successful learning strategies and as a tool for examining their own assumptions about teaching and learning.

A MAP allows the instructor to gauge how students are learning and to assess his or her teaching. It offers the time and attention of an eLearning consultant who will collect, synthesize, and help interpret student feedback, and identify appropriate teaching suggestions and print or web-based resources. Unlike end-of-term evaluations, MAP feedback goes directly to, and only to the instructor.

How do I schedule a MAP?

- MAPs are conducted during weeks 5-9 of the semester and are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Requests for a MAP should be made at least 1 week in advance of the time the assessment will be released to the students.
